STEM Update:

Our 4th grade balloon cars were a huge success! Students demonstrated perseverance and problem-solving skills while learning about Newton's Laws of Motion. Fifth graders kicked off their work with **SAM Labs**, exploring how stoplights function and learning the science behind them.

- Fourth grade also enjoyed the story *Roxaboxen* and is now designing **Santa Village** shops for our upcoming Book Fair. First graders are creating trees, second graders are making reindeer, and third graders are crafting elves—each activity is paired with a related book to bring learning to life.
