- Kindergarten will start attending the all school masses January 14th. They have been practicing and are excited to attend with the big kids. They will be celebrating 100th Day of school on Feb. 5th with a day filled with counting and math activities
- We have new books in the Library from Votive Word on Fire. They support Catholic teaching. These were purchased using book fair proceeds. Grades 3-8 are participating in a Novel Reading Challenge where they can enter to win prizes for the next three months. This is to encourage them to read books other than graphic novels. Students in

K-5 are being introduced to research sites, software, and materials used for completing research papers.

STEM Update:

- **3rd Grade:** Students will be creating snowflake models using a specific set of materials. They will work within given lesson constraints as they design and assemble their snowflakes, practicing planning, problem-solving, and creativity.
- **4th Grade:** Students will design and build paper chairs that must be strong enough to hold a stuffed animal. They may only use **two pieces of cardstock, masking tape, scissors, and a pencil**, encouraging thoughtful engineering and efficient use of materials.
- **5th Grade:** Students will design rockets that travel on SAM Labs cars. As the rockets pass an RGB LED “star,” the light will become brighter or dimmer depending on the rocket’s distance, introducing concepts of motion, distance, and sensor-based technology.
- Library/Tech: 6th graders are completing their digital art nativity scenes using Google Sheets.
